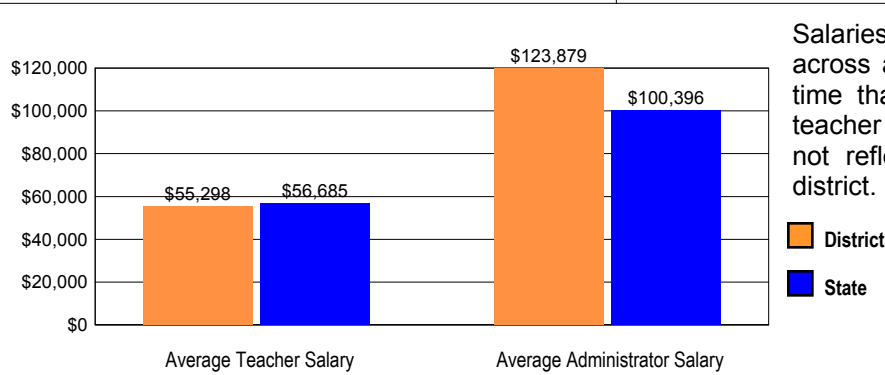

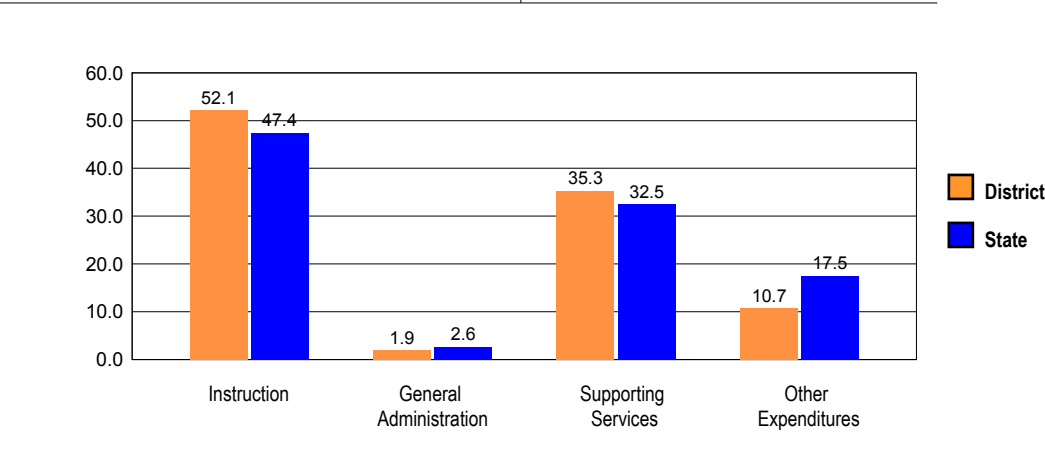
SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCES

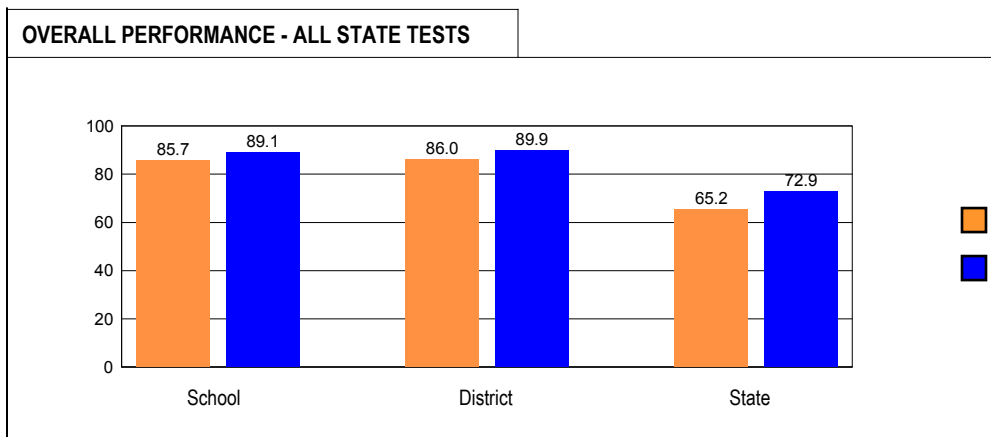

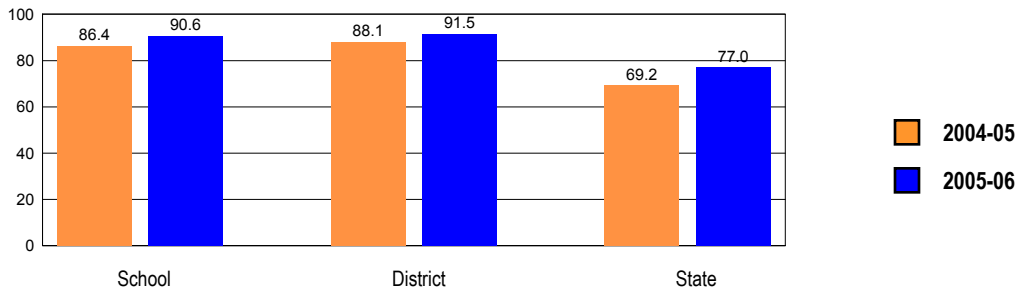
OVERALL STUDENT PERFORMANCE

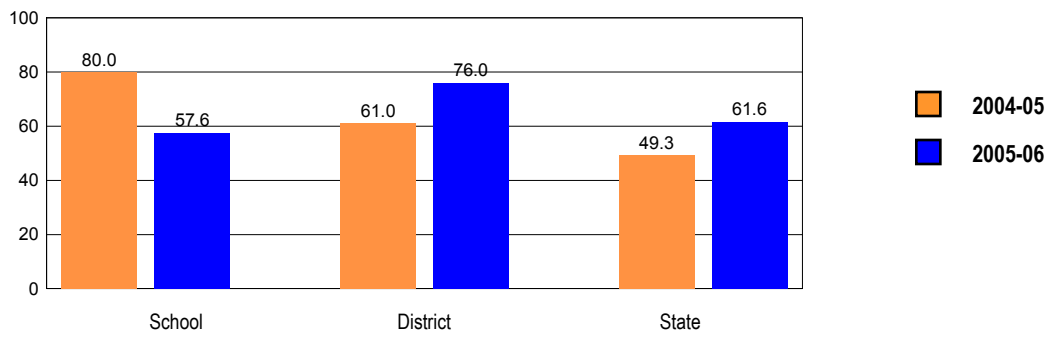

Although there were no changes in high school testing, data in high school report cards at the state level (and also at the district level for unit districts) are not comparable between the two years because of changes in elementary school testing mentioned above.



OVERALL ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT) PERFORMANCE



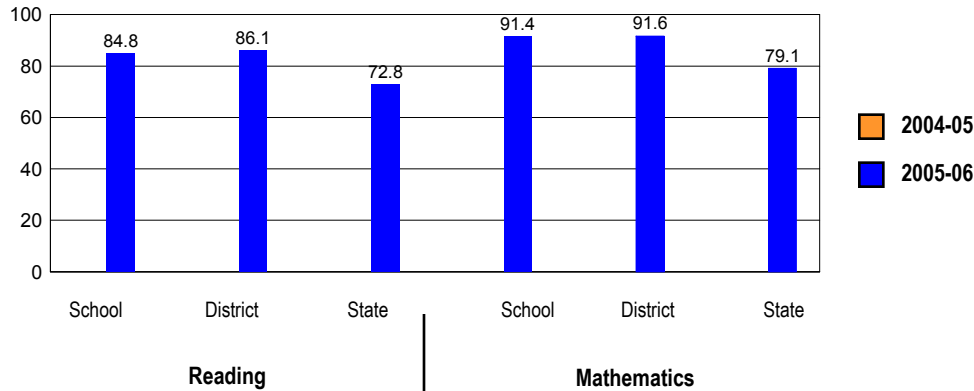
OVERALL ILLINOIS MEASURE OF ANNUAL GROWTH IN ENGLISH (IMAGE) PERFORMANCE



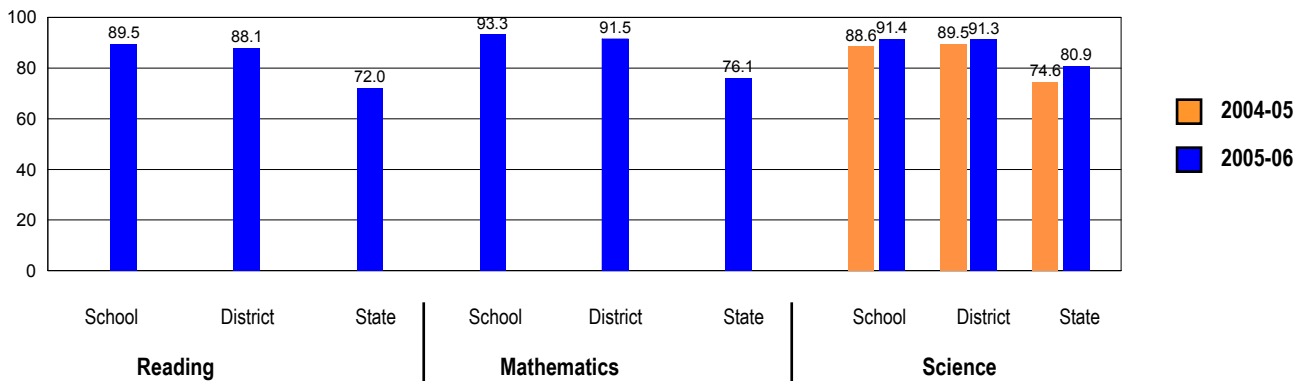
ISAT PERFORMANCE

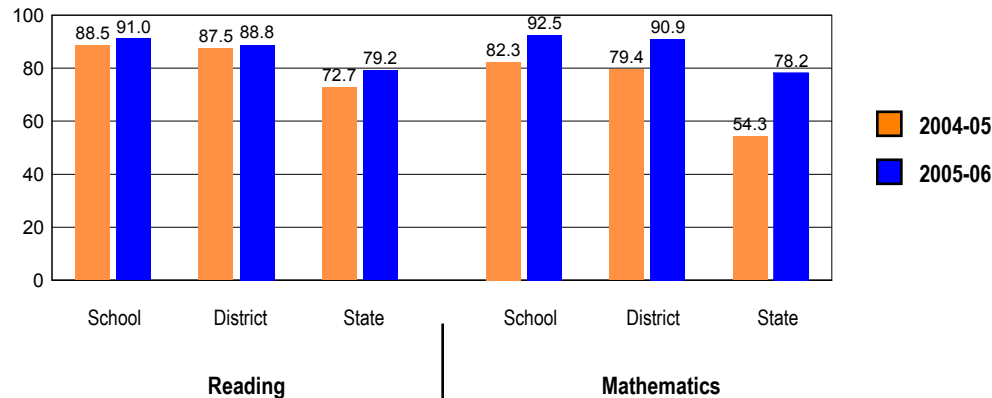
ISAT Grade 6

PERFORMANCE ON STATE ASSESSMENTS

Federal law requires that student achievement results for reading, mathematics and science for schools providing Title I services be reported to the general public.

The Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) is administered to students in grades 3 through 8. The Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE) is administered to students in grade 11. The Illinois Measure of Annual Growth in English (IMAGE) is administered to limited-English-proficient students. The Illinois Alternate Assessment (IAA) is administered to students with disabilities whose Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) indicate that participation in the ISAT or PSAE would not be appropriate.

Students with disabilities have an IEP (No Child Left Behind Act). An IEP is a written plan for a child with a disability who is eligible to receive special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

Schools with grade 2 as the highest grade in the school use a state-adopted test in reading and mathematics to meet this requirement.

In order to protect students' identities, test data for groups of fewer than ten students are not reported.

ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT)

The following tables show the percentages of student scores in each of four performance levels. These levels were established with the help of Illinois educators who teach the grade levels and learning areas tested. Due to rounding, the sum of the percentages in the four performance levels may not always equal 100.

Level 1 -- Academic Warning - Student work demonstrates limited knowledge and skills in the subject. Because of major gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills ineffectively.

Level 2 -- Below Standards - Student work demonstrates basic knowledge and skills in the subject. However, because of gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills in limited ways.

Level 3 -- Meets Standards - Student work demonstrates proficient knowledge and skills in the subject. Students effectively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems.

Level 4 -- Exceeds Standards - Student work demonstrates advanced knowledge and skills in the subject. Students creatively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems and evaluate the results.

Springman Middle School students perform well overall on the Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT). The 2005-06 results include “outstanding” performance in Reading, Math, and Science:

The figures noted refer to the percent of our students meeting or exceeding the State goals. (The percentages noted reflect ALL students tested.) These scores reflect an increase in all subject areas from the previous school year with our performance in math showing the most significant increase of approximately 10 percentage points.

In discussing the 2004-05 ISAT data, staff noted that our Hispanic students and economically disadvantaged students are not making the growth they are capable of. Our first goal focuses on the needs of these groups. We will continue the practice of student goal-setting with NWEA data to help students develop ownership and responsibility for learning. Our second goal focuses on our work with Principal-Led Problem Solving to meet the needs of students and the development of a healthy learning environment through the use of the Character Counts program “Honor Above All – Academic Integrity,” Snowflake, and a Study Skills curriculum.
